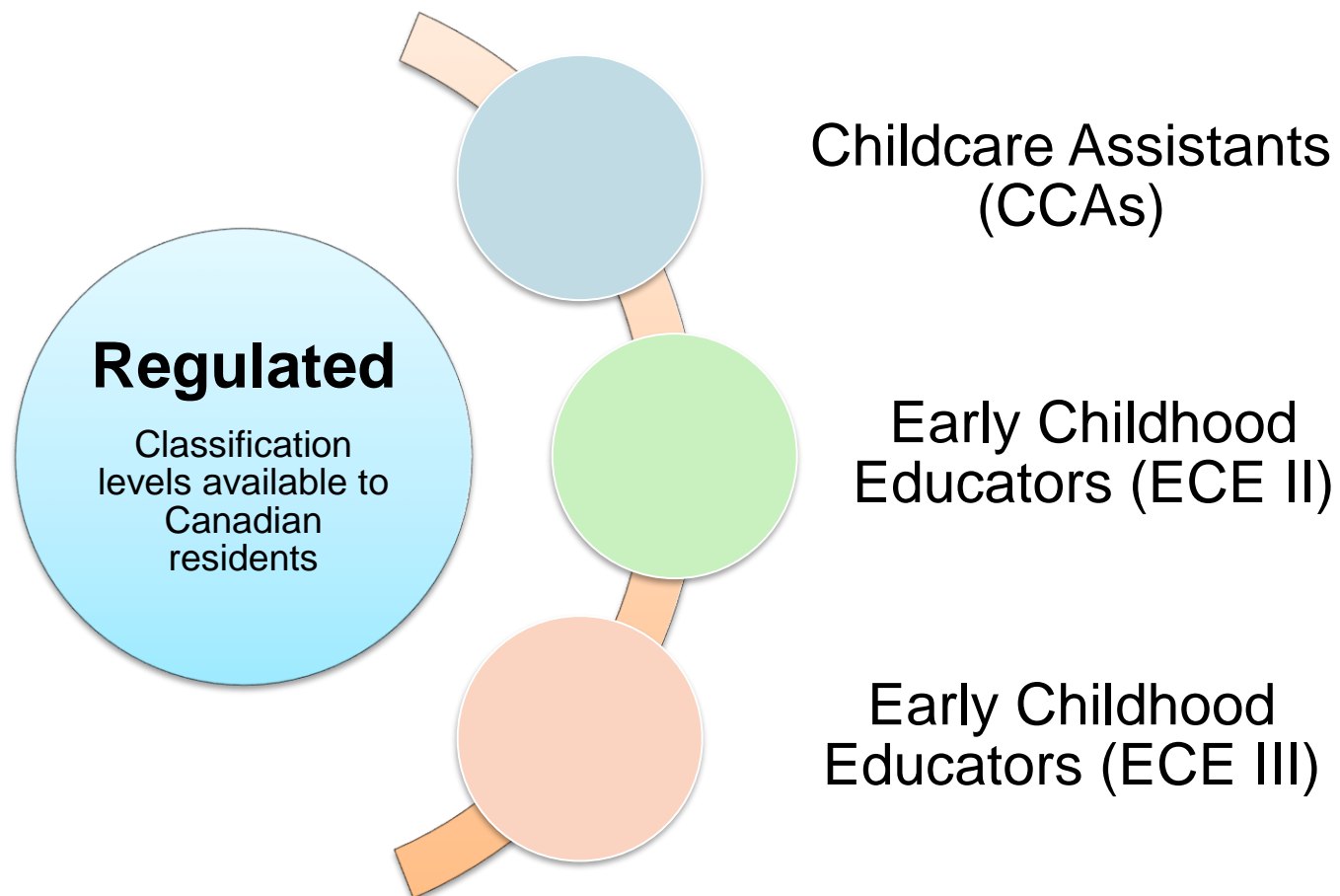
Job Duties

- Develop child-care programs that promote physical, cognitive, social development of children
- Lead activities by telling or reading stories, teaching songs, taking children to local points of interest and providing opportunities to express creativity
- Observe children for signs of potential learning or behavioural problems and prepare reports
- Guide and assist children in the development of proper eating, dressing and toilet habits
- Plan and organize activities for school-age children in child-care programs before and after regular school

Employment requirements

- Completion of a two- to four-year college program in early childhood education or a bachelor's degree in child development
- Licensing for early childhood educators is usually required

ECE Classification in Manitoba



Application Types & Requirements

Child Care Assistant (CCA)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Applicants do not need post-secondary education in ECE.• Applicants must submit two pieces of government I.D.• Complete 40-hour course within first year of employment.
Early Childhood Educator (ECE) II or III	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Degree or diploma in ECE with a minimum of 1800 – 2000 study hours including 520 hours of fieldwork/practicum• Additional credential above diploma level for ECE III Example: <u>Advanced Diploma In Leadership In Early Childhood Care & Education</u>
Upgrade Classification	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• CCAs or ECE IIs may apply for higher classification if they have completed further education in ECE.• Applicants must submit original transcripts with application.
Reissue Classification Certificate	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Applicants who need a replacement certificate may request a reissue. Applicants whose name has changed must provide proof of name change with application.

Recognized Education for (ECEs)



Education that is not a minimum of 2 years in length, or not specific to ECE (such as a Bachelor of Education, Bachelor of Human Ecology, Diploma in Child and Youth Care) or a Montessori Diploma is not recognized for classification as an ECE II or ECE III in Manitoba.

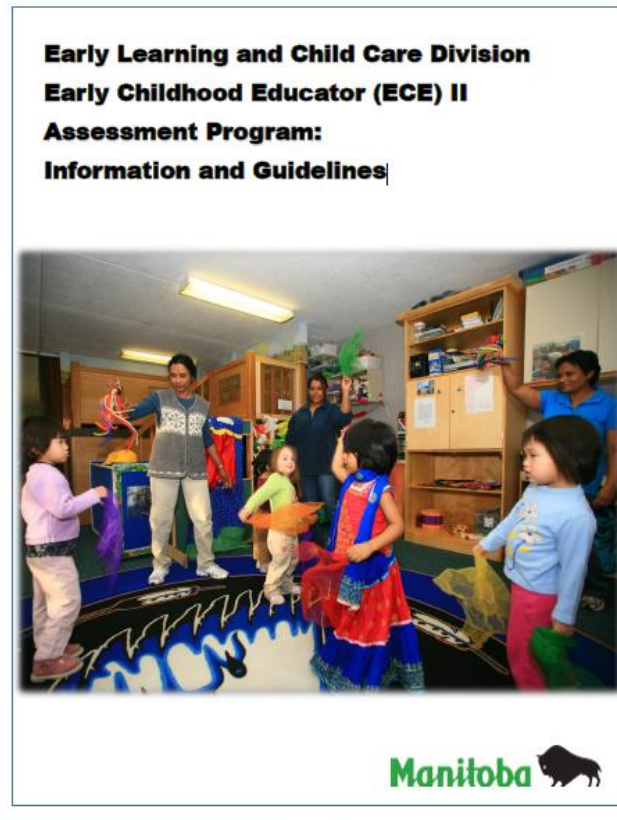
Internationally-educated ECEs

The ELCC Program may conduct an educational equivalency assessment in consultation with a provincial government department, college or university.

Applicants may be required to submit a credential assessment report from a specified credential assessment agency

English or French is required to teach early years in Canada

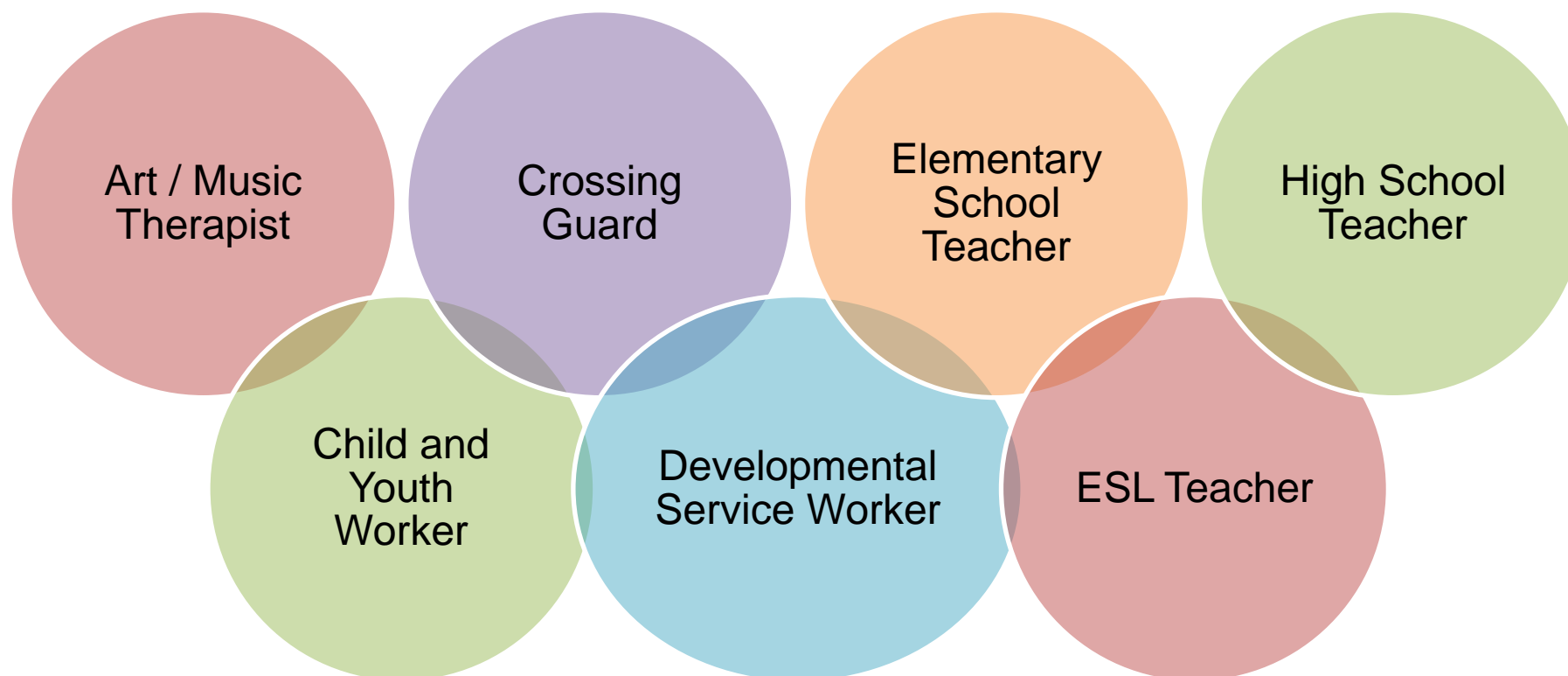

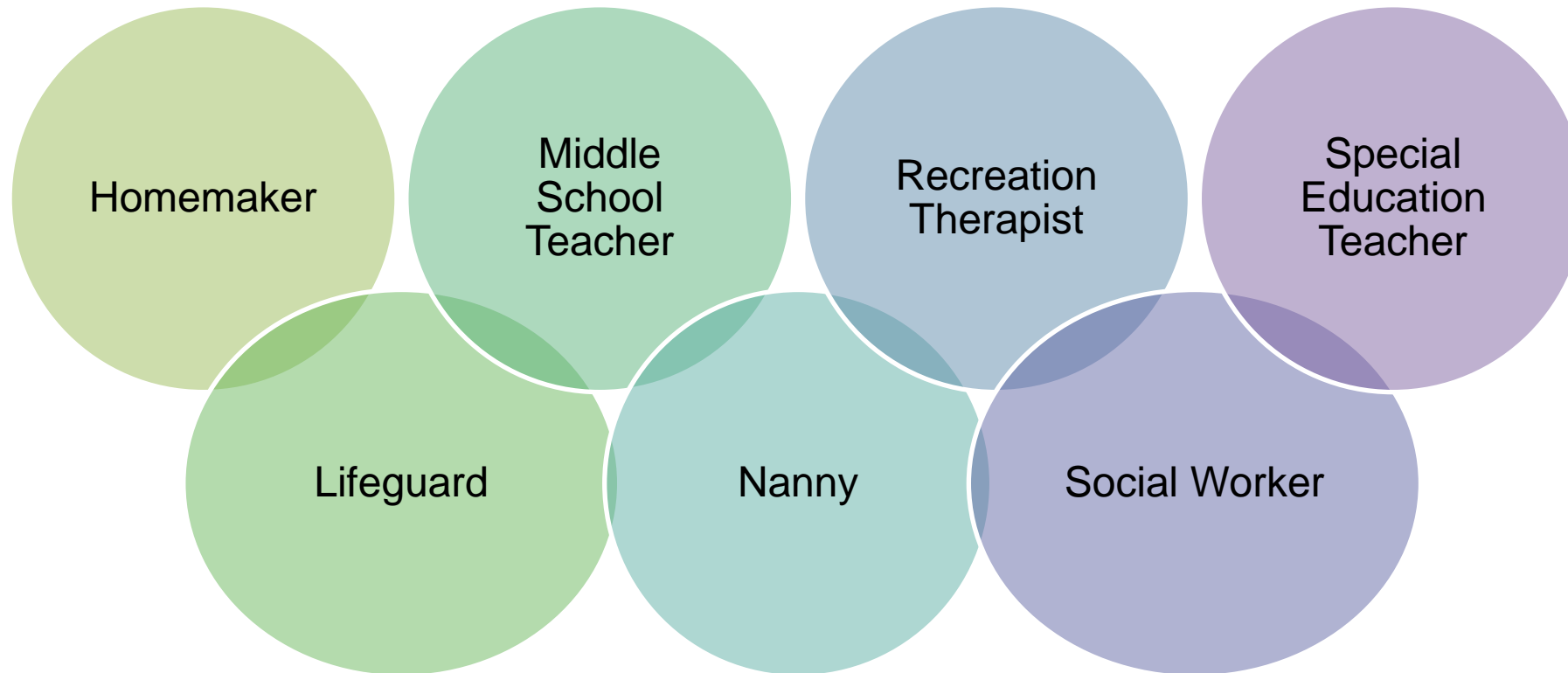

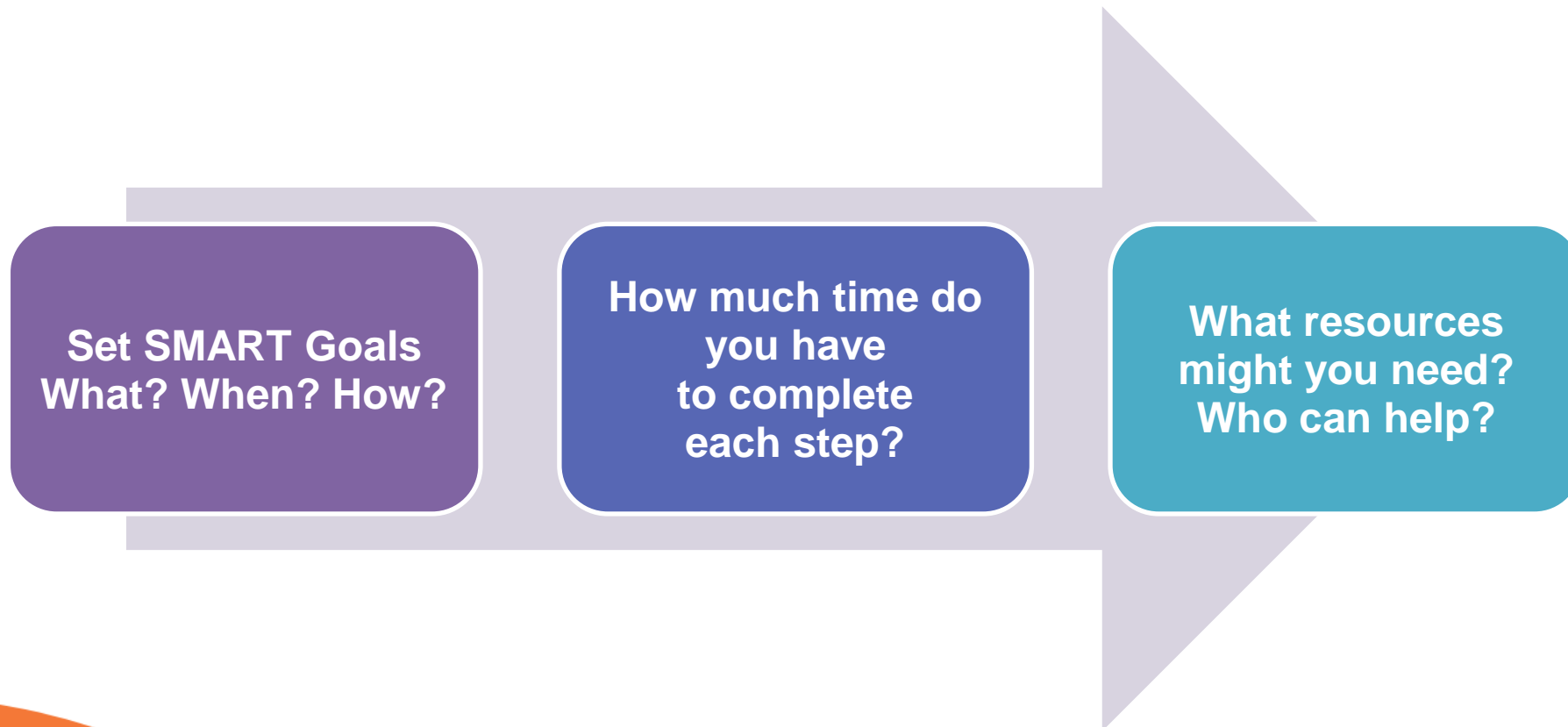

Job Search Preparation

 - Apply for Security Clearance Checks (criminal record check, child abuse registry, adult abuse registry, immunizations record) Date: May 3, 2021
