What Roles do Lawyers in Canada Perform?

Job Duties

- Lawyers represent and advise clients during legal proceedings like trials or negotiations ensuing clients know their legal rights and responsibilities.
- Advise clients of their legal rights and responsibilities
- Represent clients in court and in legal negotiations
- Research regulations or previous case laws and draw up legal documents, such as wills and contracts
- May act as mediator, conciliator or arbitrator
- May act as executor, trustee or guardian in estate and family law matters.

Employment requirements

- Completion of a bachelor's degree from a recognized law school and successful completion of the bar examination and a period of articling are required.
- Licensing by the provincial or territorial law society is required.



Internationally-educated Lawyers



To practise law in Manitoba you must be a member of the Law Society of Manitoba.

The LSM is reviewing admission criteria for articling students.


Applicants going through the National Committee on Accreditation process should be aware they will be required to obtain a Certificate of Qualification before they can article in Manitoba.



Practicing Law in Manitoba

STEP 1: Certificate of Qualification (National Committee on Accreditation)

 Internationally trained applicants must obtain a Certificate of Qualification from the National Committee on Accreditation verifying their academic training and experience is equivalent to Canadian standards.







Practicing Law in Manitoba

STEP 2: Articling and PREP

- Complete 52 weeks of articling with a Manitoba lawyer and Practice Readiness Education Program.
- To article, you must be a person of good character and fit to practise law, you must have a Certificate of Qualification and you will need to find a Manitoba lawyer who can act as your principal (supervisor) for 52 weeks.

Articling Student, attach required documentation Steps A notarized copy of photo identification which includes your full name. **Original postsecondary** transcripts with final grades & Certificate of Required **Qualification from NCA Criminal record checks** sent directly from the RCMP to the Law Society Provide certificate of standing and character Confirmation of Articles, Articling Agreement and **Education Plan**




Practicing Law in Manitoba

STEP 3: Admission and Call To Bar

(a) submit application and petition for call and admission

(b) remit call to the bar fee (\$630.00)



(c) submit application to commence active practice

(e) submit final assessment of education plan

(d) certificate of completion of articles (if applicable)



Practicing as Foreign Legal Consultants

In order to practise as a foreign legal consultant, you will need to submit:

- An application for a permit to act as a foreign legal consultant
- A certificate of good standing or other documentation from your home jurisdiction showing that you are a member in good standing
- Evidence of your length of practise in your home jurisdiction
- Two certificates of good character
- An undertaking to submit to the jurisdiction of The Law Society of Manitoba and to comply with The Legal Profession Act, Law Society Rules and the Code of Professional Conduct.
- Evidence of professional liability insurance
- Evidence of defalcation compensation coverage.
- Application fee

English or French proficiency improves chances of success








