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What Roles do Physiotherapists in Canada Perform?

Job Duties

- Assess clients' physical abilities through evaluative procedures such as functional ability tests and make a physiotherapy diagnosis.
- Establish treatment goals with patients based on diagnoses.
- Develop and implement physiotherapy treatment plans including therapeutic exercise, manipulations, massage, education, electrotherapy, hydrotherapy, and other modalities.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of treatment plans and modify them accordingly.
- Provide advice on exercise and strategies to implement at home to enhance and or maintain treatment.
- Communicate with referring physicians and other healthcare professionals regarding clients' problems, needs and progress.
- Maintain clinical and statistical records and confer with other healthcare professionals.
- Develop and implement health promotion programs for clients, staff, and the community.
- May conduct research in physiotherapy.
- Provide consulting or education services as required.

Employment requirements

- A master's degree in physiotherapy and a period of supervised practical training are required.
- A license or registration with a regulatory body is required in all provinces and territories.
- Completion of a physiotherapist competency examination is required in all provinces and territories.

College of Physiotherapists of Manitoba (CPM) Physiotherapy is a regulated profession in Canada. Each province and territory has its own regulator and registration requirements. To legally practice physiotherapy in Manitoba, you must be registered with CPM.

The Canadian Alliance of Physiotherapy Regulators (CAPR) is a credentialling and assessment agency that provides Evaluation Services on behalf of its Members – the Canadian provincial and territorial physiotherapy regulators (called Colleges). They review the education and qualifications of applicants educated outside of Canada to determine whether or not they are substantially different from those of Canadian-educated physiotherapists.

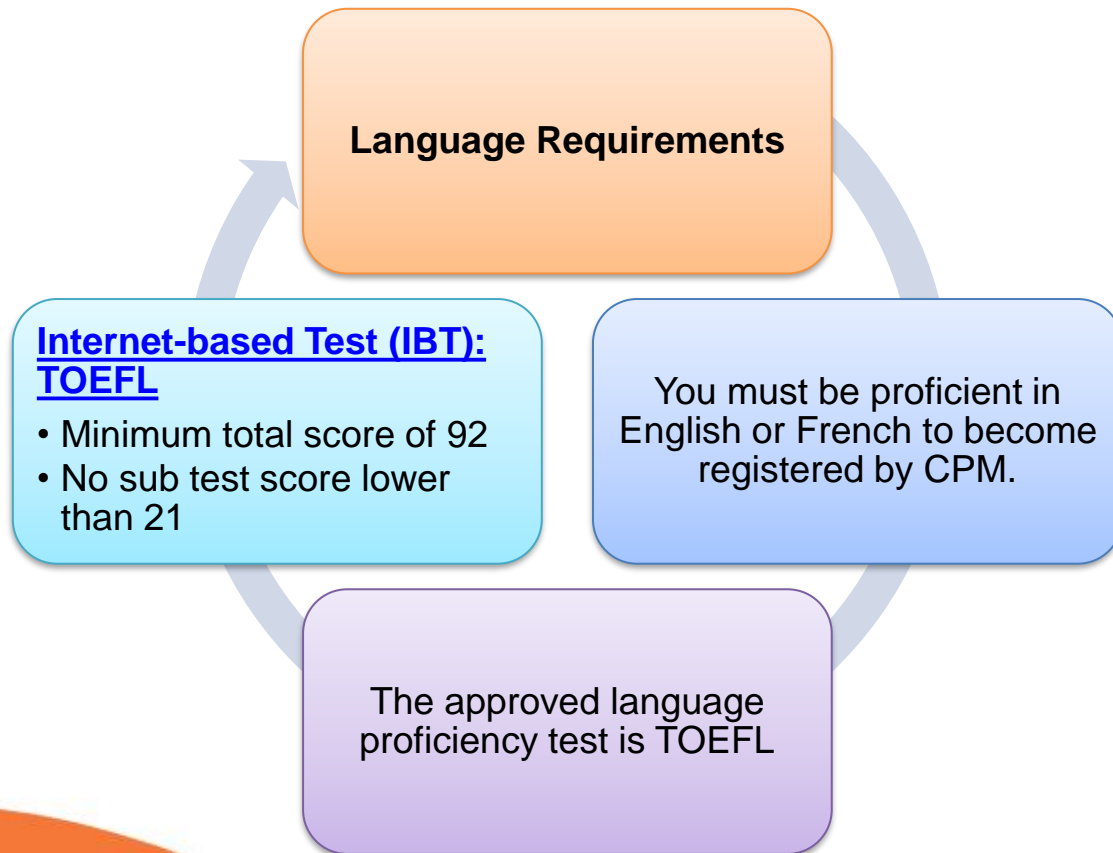

Ensure that you have completed a university-level, entry-to-practice degree (or credential by another name) in physiotherapy, awarded by a recognized institution authorized to issue credentials equivalent to a degree in Canada. Diplomas awarded by a non-university institution may be accepted if assessed and determined to be equivalent to at least a Bachelor's degree in Canada

Step 1: Complete the credentialing process with the Canadian Alliance of Physiotherapy Regulators (CAPR) www.alliancept.org

Task 1: Submit a complete application

Task 2: CAPR assesses your application to determine:

- ☐ If you hold authentic academic credentials
- ☐ If your education is not substantially different from Canadian education
- ☐ If your qualifications make you eligible to register for Part 1 of the Physiotherapist Competency Exam (PCE)

Step 2: Exam Part 1(CPAR)

Task 1: Register for the Written Component (Qualifying Exam) with the Canadian Alliance of Physiotherapy Regulators (CAPR)

- A multiple-choice exam tests your knowledge of physiotherapy and your ability to solve clinical problems using clinical scenarios. Exams are available to write in Winnipeg, Manitoba, and are available to write 6 times a year.

- CAPR has registration deadlines for the written component. Check the CAPR website to ensure you apply on time.

Step 3: Employment under Supervision (Manitoba Employer)

Task 1: Secure Employment

- Contact an employer and tell them you want to register with CPM and that you need to work under supervision.

Task 2: Letter of Offer

- Ask your employer to write a Letter of Offer, which includes:
 - Your place of employment
 - A statement that you will begin employment once you become registered as an Exam Candidate
 - The date you will begin employment
 - If applicable, confirmation that your employer will provide you with a minimum of \$5 million in Professional Liability Insurance coverage

Step 4: Exam Candidate (CPM)

Task 1: Required Documents

- Proof of completion of the Written Component (Physiotherapy Competency Exam). Submit a [Verification Request Form](#)
- Criminal Record Check with the vulnerable sector, and submit the original certificate to CPM
- Complete the [Application for Registration Form \(PDF\)](#) to apply for registration as an Exam Candidate
- Submit the original Letter of Offer provided to you by your employer
- Supervised Practice Agreement
- Confirmation of Professional Liability Insurance Coverage
- Copy of your Diploma, Baccalaureate, Master's, or Doctorate degree in physiotherapy
- Submit a Membership in Good Standing Form/Regulatory History from the last two College(s) in which you were registered

If you have **not** secured employment

Submit these required documents to CPM:

- ✓ Verification Request Form
- ✓ Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Check
- ✓ Application Form

Once you have secured employment

Submit these required documents to CPM before you start work:

- ✓ Letter of Offer
- ✓ Supervised Practice Agreement
- ✓ Professional Liability Insurance Coverage

Decision

If you have secured employment you will receive:

A decision letter that confirms that you have been registered as an Exam Candidate

Instructions for printing your Certificate of Registration and Receipt for Registration Fees

If you have NOT secured employment you will receive:

- A Letter of Eligibility that explains that you will become registered upon receipt of your outstanding required documents:
- Letter of Offer
- Supervised Practice Agreement
- Confirmation of Insurance
- Registration Fee

Step 5: Practiced-Based Competency Component

The Practice Based Competency Assessment (PBCA) is the clinical evaluation chosen by Council in Manitoba.

Eligibility Criteria for Assessment

- Applicants must have been registered on the Exam Candidate Register in Manitoba for a minimum of 6 months.
- Applicants must have successfully completed 1200 hours of supervised practice in Manitoba. These hours must be confirmed by a signed letter from the employer on workplace letterhead.
- Applicants must not have any outstanding complaints or be subject to any unresolved discipline proceedings.

Step 5: Practiced-Based Competency Component Application Process

- CPM will verify the application and applicant eligibility. Ineligible applicants will be informed in writing by CPM. Eligible applicants will be asked to submit supporting documents for assessment.

Step 6: Active Practice

Once you completed the Practice Based Competency Assessment, you may register for the Active Practice and work unsupervised.

Registration Process Timelines

1. **Credentiailling process with the Canadian Alliance of Physiotherapy Regulators (CAPR)**
 - Timeline: 6+ months
 - Cost: \$1,415
2. **Qualifying Exam) with the Canadian Alliance of Physiotherapy Regulators (CAPR)**
 - Timeline: CAPR will mail you information about the location and date of your exam upon receipt of your application. You will receive your exam results by mail within 6 weeks.
 - Cost: \$1,303
3. **Employment under Supervision (Manitoba Employer)**
 - Timeline: Secure employment and obtain a Letter of Offer with a start date
 - Obtain a Supervisor and Complete a Supervised Practice Agreement
 - Obtain Professional Liability Insurance
 - Cost: \$0
4. **Exam Candidate with the College of Physiotherapy of Manitoba (CPM)**
 - Cost: Exam Candidate Registration fee of \$598.69 + \$100 for the initial registration fee
- Decision**
 - Timeline: CPM will take up to 1 week to process your application. CPM will send you the following by email
5. **Practice-Based Competency Assessment**
 - Cost: \$1000
6. **Active Practice**
 - Cost: \$798.25 or **\$399.13 prorated**
