


#### **Job Duties**

- Develop, implement, and evaluate nutrition programs and services for individuals, communities, and populations
- Manage food service systems in hospitals, long-term care facilities, schools, privately owned-food service outlets or similar settings
- Provide nutrition guidance, label interpretation and consultation services to health professionals, individuals, dietetic interns, community groups, government, and the media
- Evaluate nutritional status of individuals and aid in the prevention and/or treatment of inadequate nutrition
- Plan, evaluate and conduct nutrition education programs and develop educational materials for various audiences
- Practice on an individual basis or as a member of an interdisciplinary team to determine nutritional needs of patients and to plan, implement and evaluate normal and therapeutic diets to maintain and enhance general health
- Analyze current scientific nutritional studies, conduct research, and evaluate program
  effectiveness to improve the nutritional value, taste, appearance, and preparation of food
- Work within industry in the development, testing and evaluation, and marketing of food and nutrition products or as a company representative supplying product related information to health professionals
- Confer with other health professionals, community groups, government, and the media to provide consultation and advice in areas of nutrition interpretation, intervention, and policy
- Supervise training of dietetic interns.

#### **Employment Requirements**

- Dietitians require a bachelor's degree in dietetics, nutrition, or a related field such as food and nutritional science from a program accredited by the Partnership for Dietetic Education and Practice (PDEP), and a period of supervised practical training.
- Successful completion of the Canadian Dietetic Registration Exam (CDRE) is required in all provinces except Quebec.
- Registration with a regulatory body is required in all provinces for dietitians.
- Membership in the national association, Dietitians of Canada, is voluntary.
- Registration with a regulatory body is required for nutritionists in Nova Scotia,
   Quebec and Alberta. In the remaining provinces, nutritionists may require the same education and practical training as dietitians.
- Membership with the national association, Dietitians of Canada, and/or a provincial regulatory body is available for nutritionists who have the same education and practical training as dietitians.



#### College of Dieticians of Manitoba (CDM) Process

There are three non-exemptible requirements for membership into the College:

#### 1) Academic Requirement

- University Degree in Human Nutritional Sciences, or equivalent.

#### 2) Internship/Practicum Requirement

- A dietetic internship or practicum program that is equivalent to a Canadian accredited program and supervised by a registered dietitian.
- A standard internship/practicum in Canada is 35-40 weeks

#### 3) Currency Requirement

- The College of Dietitians of Manitoba considers an applicant up to date if they have completed all the qualifications within three years prior to the date of application.

#### **Other Requirements**

- IELTS overall band score of 7.
- Proof of current registration in good standing with your country/state licensing body (if applicable)
- Information on professional development/continuing education activities.
- Criminal record check, adult abuse, and child abuse registry check.

Graduate Dietician Registered Dietician in Manitoba

- All Internationally Educated Dietitians must submit this initial application. The College will review your application to determine the steps you must complete.
- Some Internationally Educated Dietitians are required to upgrade their education.
- Some Internationally Educated Dietitians are eligible to undergo the SET assessment.
- Generally offered twice a year in the Spring and Fall, conducted by the University of Alberta using a virtual platform.
- All Internationally Educated Dietitians must:
  - Register as a Graduate Dietitian
  - Write the Canadian Dietetic Registration Examination (CDRE)
  - As a Graduate Dietitian, you can work with some restrictions.
- All Internationally Educated Dietitians who pass the exam (CDRE) will automatically be upgraded to Registered Dietitian (RD) from Graduate Dietitian.
- Renew your membership annually
- Mandatory participation in the <u>Continuing</u> <u>Competence</u> Program


