

What Roles do Optometrists in Canada Perform?





Optometrists

Job Duties

- Examine patients' eyes, conduct tests, and use ophthalmoscopes, biomicroscopes and other specialized instruments to determine ocular health and visual efficiency
- Prescribe and provide treatment (excluding surgery) to maintain, improve and correct vision and manage other ocular diseases and disorders
- Prescribe, dispense, and fit eyeglasses, contact lenses and other visual aids
- Educate, counsel, and advise patients on contact lens use and care, ocular hygiene, surgical and non-surgical options, and preventive care and maintenance related to occupation and lifestyle
- Refer patients to ophthalmologists or other physicians and surgeons for treatment of ocular diseases or conditions such as cataracts, glaucoma and macular degeneration and systemic conditions such as diabetes and high blood pressure
- Collaborate with ophthalmologists and other healthcare professionals to provide pre- and post-operative care for patients undergoing eye surgeries such as laser vision correction
- Optometrists may specialize in fitting visual aids for people who are partially blind, fitting contact lenses or correcting special vision problems.
- · May prescribe from a limited list of medications
- Conduct research and promote advancement in the visual sciences

Employment Requirements

- Three years of university undergraduate studies or, in Quebec, completion of a college program in sciences and a four- to five-year university program in optometry are required.
- Licensing by the provincial or territorial regulatory governing body is required.

Transcript Assessments


Credential assessment services are provided through FORAC.

Federation of Optometric Regulatory Authorities of Canada (FORAC)

- Federation of Optometric Regulatory Authorities of Canada (FORAC)
- FORAC requires an evaluation of the applicant's education credentials from World Education Services (WES-ICAP, \$260).
- If the applicant's optometry degree program was not conducted in English, FORAC will require successful completion of an English proficiency test.
- FORAC's assessment will determine if the applicant is eligible to challenge the IGOE Exam.




Getting Stared with the MAO Process



- Before initiating the application process, potential applicants can prepare as follows:
 - English language proficiency will be required if the applicant's optometric degree program was not conducted in English. These applicants will need to achieve a minimum score on a test approved by FORAC:
 - <u>IELTS</u> (General) Minimum overall average of 7.5, no score lower than 7
 - PTE Minimum overall average of 80, no score lower than 70
 - CELPIP (General) Minimum overall average of 9, with no score lower than 8
 - Official notice of the results of your English language test must be submitted to the FORAC Credentialing
 Office at the time of your application.



Getting Stared with the MAO Process




- Before initiating the application process, potential applicants can prepare as follows:
 - Canada's English language optometry school is the
 University of Waterloo School of Optometry and Vision
 Science. Course listings for the University's Doctor of
 Optometry program can be found on the University's
 website: click here. Applicants may wish to review the
 course listings for comparison with the courses taken in the
 applicant's optometric degree program. This will give the
 applicant an idea of how similar the applicant's optometric
 education was to a Canadian optometric education.
 - Canadian citizenship, permanent resident status or convention refugee status must be established prior to participation in the IOBP bridging program. To register in Manitoba, if the applicant is not a Canadian citizen, then proof of ability to work in Canada must be provided.

Getting Stared with the MAO Process



- Before initiating the application process, potential applicants can prepare as follows:
 - Start preparing application documents. Many documents can be requested in advance and will remain valid throughout the application process (however, please note that the criminal record checks must be dated within the 6month period prior to Manitoba registration).
 - Review the <u>FORAC</u> website to gain a better understanding of the steps involved.
 - Review the Manitoba Association of Optometrists
 International Applicants Time and Cost page to gain a
 better understanding of the time and financial
 commitments required to complete the process.




