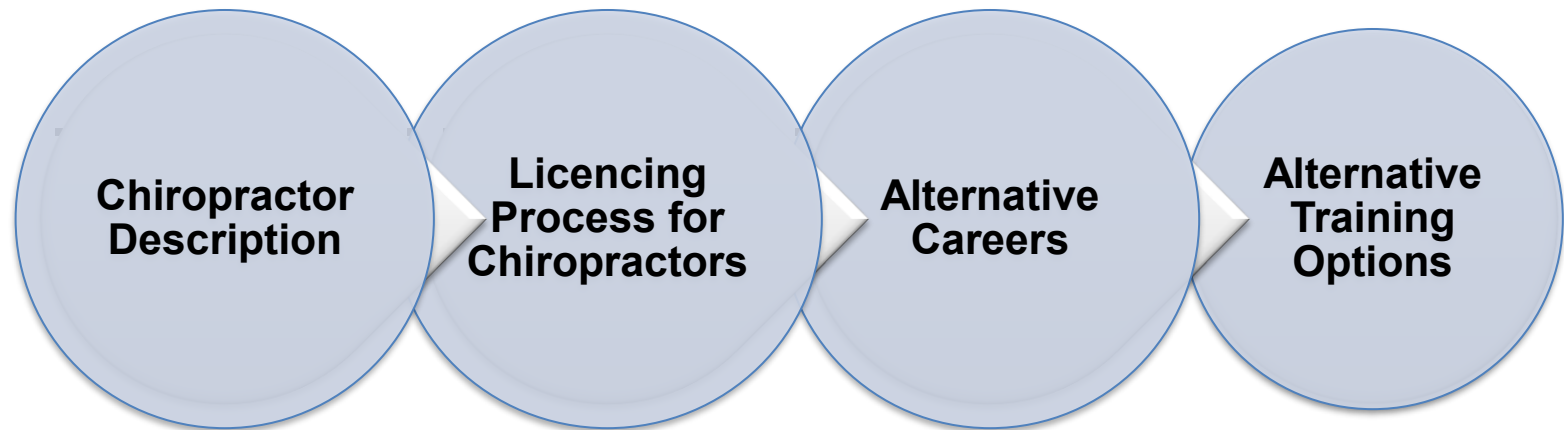

Job Duties

- Plan, set up and administer accounting systems and prepare financial information for businesses
- Examine accounting records and prepare financial statements and reports
- Provide financial advice and explain the implications of financial decisions to managers and executives
- Develop and maintain cost finding, reporting and internal control procedures
- Examine financial accounts and records and prepare income tax returns from accounting records
- Analyze financial statements and reports and provide financial, business and tax advice
- May act as a trustee in bankruptcy proceedings

Employment requirements

- Bachelors' degree in accounting
- Registration with a regulatory body such as CPA Manitoba
- 2/3 years college program in accounting may work as Accounting Technician/Clerk

Internationally Educated Chiropractors



The MCA classify International Applicants as:

- Graduation from an approved chiropractic college.
- Completion of the Canadian Chiropractic Examination Board (CCEB).
- Active chiropractic licensure outside Canada.

Chiropractor Licensure Pathway

Complete and Submit the MCA Licensing and Registration Application form.

MCA will conduct credential assessment of educational equivalency.

Meet any additional requirements.

Accredited institutions may be able to bypass licensure pathway to direct obtaining of licence from regulatory body.

Provide required supportive documentation and credentials.

If the credential assessment is approved, applicants are eligible to proceed to the Canadian Chiropractic Examining Board (CCEB) exams and the Jurisprudence Exam.

Complete National Exams and any additional decided educational requirements.

Documents may include fee payment, supporting documentation, language proficiency results, references, and background checks.

Obtain Chiropractic Licence from MCA.

MCA Credential Assessment

- MCA reviews education, transcripts, accreditation, and proof of licensure (if applicable) to assess whether the education is equivalent to Canadian chiropractic standards.
- Based on the review, applications may be approved to proceed to the CCEB exams and remaining licensure steps in Manitoba, or may require further review if gaps are identified.
- If gaps are identified, additional training may be required, and eligibility to take the CCEB exams will be determined.
- Applications from non-accredited programs may undergo further review, with an appeal option if requirements are not met.

Canadian Chiropractic Examination Board Examination (CCEB)

The Canadian Chiropractic Examining Board (CCEB) Certificate is a clinical competency certificate awarded upon successful completion of the three-component CCEB examination.

- Component A: Basic and Applied Sciences
- Component B: Clinical Decision Making and Diagnostic Imaging (taken after completing the Component A exam)
- Component C: Clinical Skills Evaluation (taken after completing the Component A exam)

- *International applicants with over 3 years experience in a regulated environment may not have to take the Component A exam.*

It consists of a written multiple-choice exam (MCQ) and a separate clinical skills (OSCE) exam assessing clinical knowledge, decision-making, and readiness for safe chiropractic practice in Canada.

The written exam is one day, and the OSCE uses timed stations to assess clinical reasoning, assessment skills, and professional judgment in simulated scenarios.

Language Proficiency

- Applicants must demonstrate fluency in English or French, with advanced skills in reading, writing, listening, and speaking strongly recommended.
- Registration is conducted in English, and all documents must be submitted in English or certified translations.
- English is the primary language of healthcare in Manitoba.

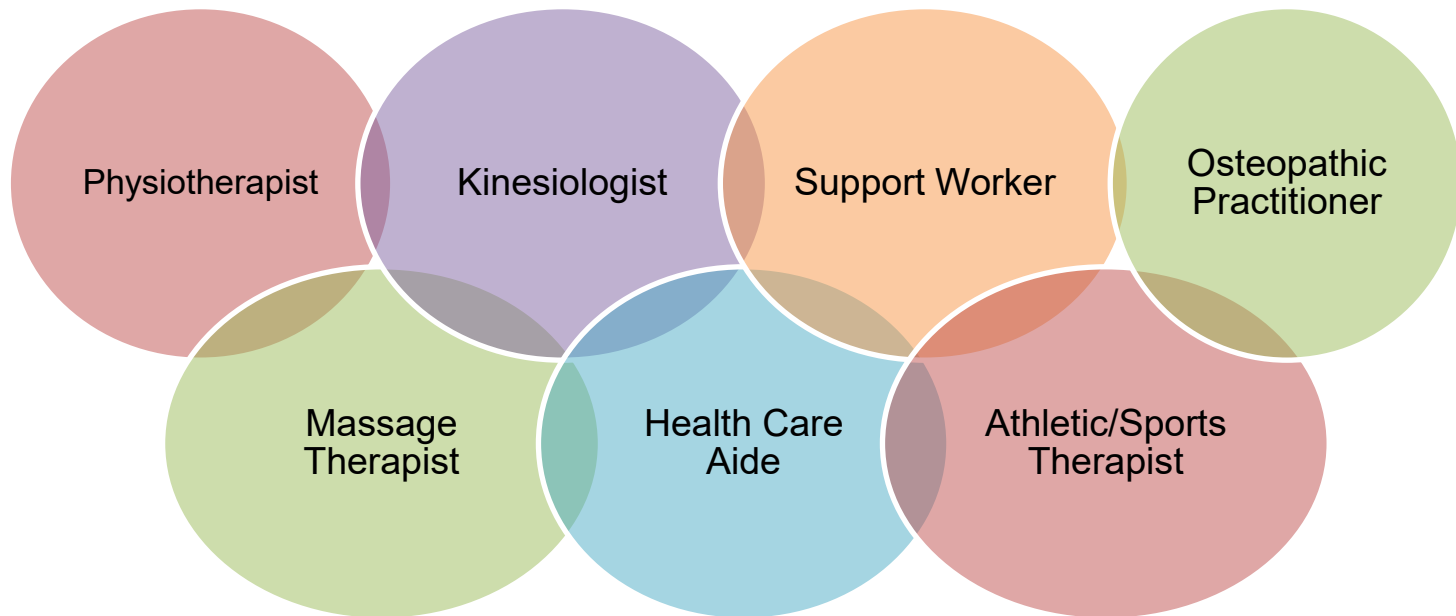

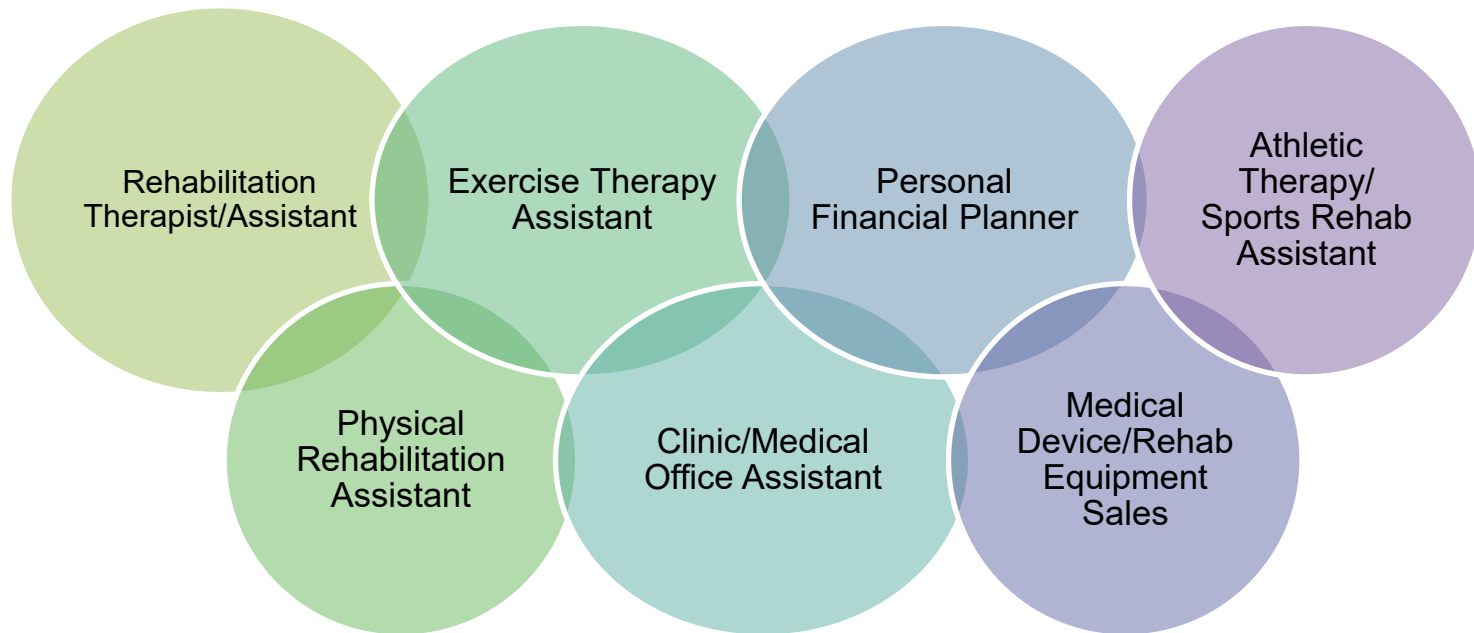

Alternative Training Options



Accredited Programs

Additional training or bridging may be required if gaps are identified for some Internationally educated individuals.

- There is no current accredited Doctor of Chiropractic (D.C.) programs in Manitoba.

There are Pre-Chiropractic pathways in Manitoba which then often can be then transferred to accredited colleges.

- **The University of Winnipeg:** Offers a formal articulation agreement with CMCC, allowing for a potential 7-year dual degree pathway.
- **University of Manitoba:** Offers preparatory science courses.
- **Université de Saint-Boniface:** Offers pre-professional studies.
- **Brandon University:** Offers pre-professional studies.
- **Canadian Mennonite University:** Offers pre-professional studies

Accredited institutions for Doctors of Chiropractic (D.C.) programs can be completed in other provinces.

- **Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College (CMCC)** in Toronto.
- **Université du Québec à Trois-Rivières (UQTR)** in Quebec.
