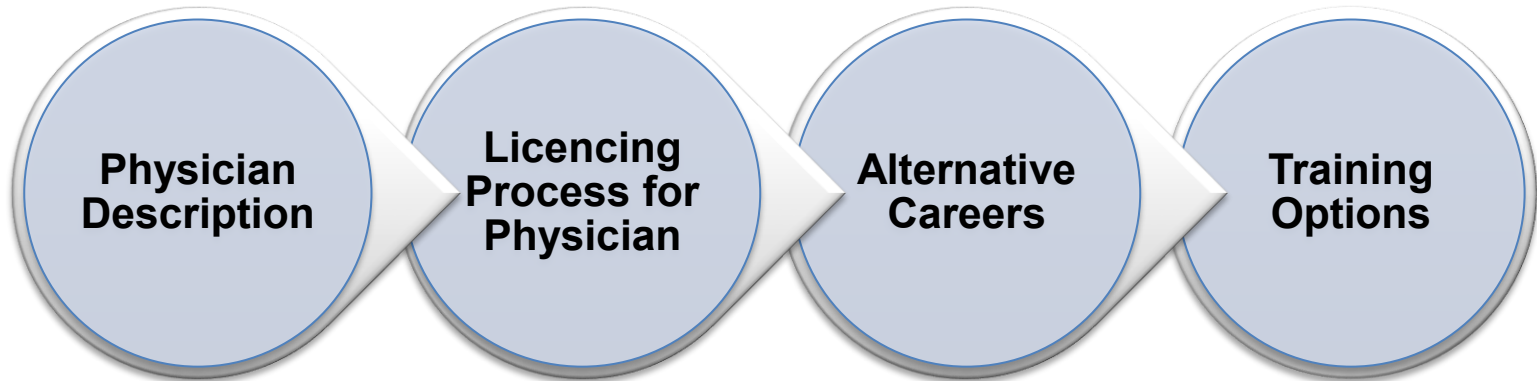

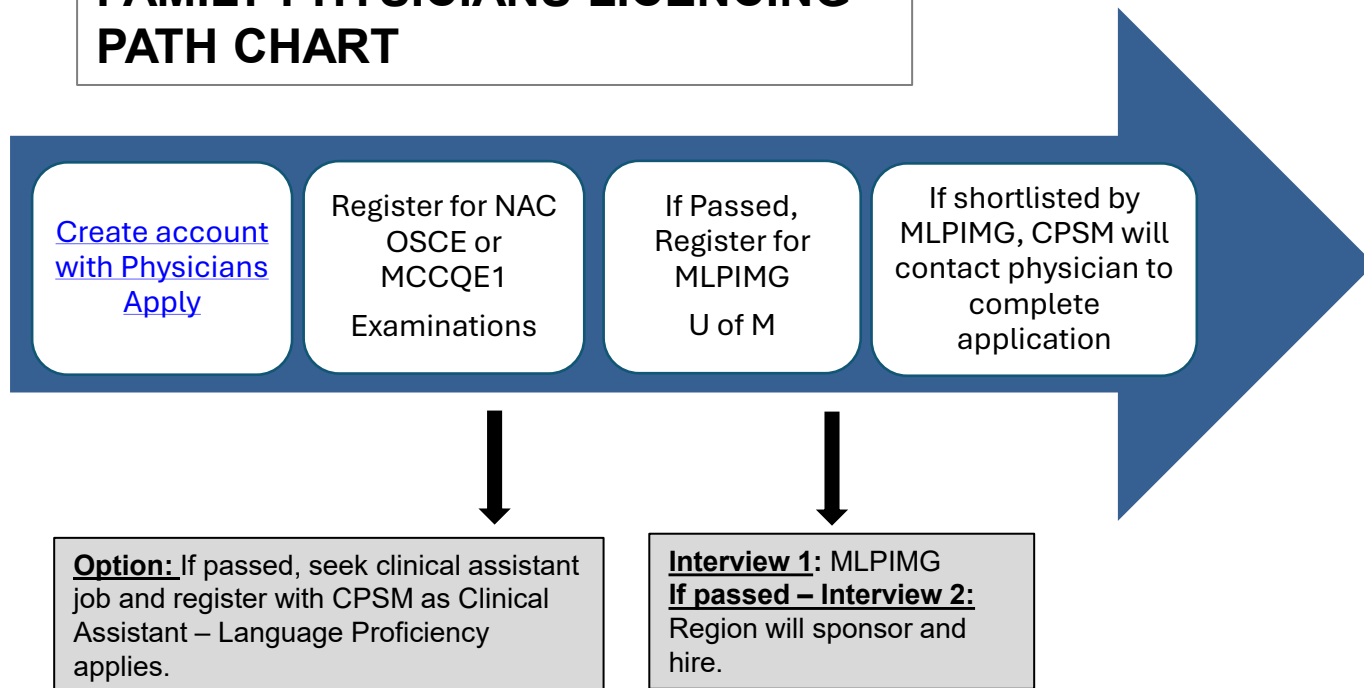
Job Duties

- Examine patients and take their histories, order laboratory tests, X-rays and other diagnostic procedures and consult with other medical practitioners to treat patients
- Prescribe or administer medications and treatments
- Perform or assist in routine surgery and provide acute and emergency care
- Vaccinate patients to prevent and treat diseases
- Deliver babies and provide pre-natal and post-natal care and counselling to families on health issues
- Co-ordinate or manage primary patient care
- Report births, deaths, and contagious and other diseases to governmental authorities

Employment requirements

- Graduation from approved medical school and 2/3 years of family medicine residency training
- Completion of the qualifying examinations of the Medical Council of Canada. Additional training required for specialist doctors

NOTE: employment opportunities for physicians with the requirement for a Practice Ready Assessment – Specialty Practice (PRA-SP) may be limited and the process can be lengthy. As applications with CPSM are only valid for 6 months from the date they are received, it is suggested that an application not be made unless you are offered an employment/sponsorship opportunity.”

Internationally-educated Physicians



The [Medical Council of Canada \(MCC\)](#) plays an important role in the assessment of physicians in Canada. The MCC does not confer licences to physicians. Provincial Medical Regulatory Authorities (MRAs) such as [The College of Physicians and Surgeons of Manitoba \(CPSM\)](#) confer licenses.

The MCC grants a qualification known as the [Licentiate of the Medical Council of Canada \(LMCC\)](#) to medical graduates who meet the following criteria:

Application for medical registration If you want to practice medicine in one of Canada's 13 provinces or territories, you must first apply for medical registration with the Medical Regulatory Authority (MRA) for that jurisdiction.

- Your physiciansapply.ca account gives you a secure, web-based process for applying to one or more MRAs.
- After logging into your account, simply click Applications for medical registration on the left panel to start the application process.
- All of your medical credentials, exam results and other information already stored in your account will be pre-populated into your applications, making it quick and easy to apply to several Canadian MRAs.
- There is a one-time non-refundable fee for setting up your physiciansapply.ca account

Medical Council of Canada Exams The National Assessment Collaboration Exam

[The National Assessment Collaboration \(NAC\) exam](#) is required for residency in Canada. NAC is a one-day exam that assesses your readiness to enter a Canadian residency program. It is a national, standardized examination that tests knowledge, skills, and attitudes essential for entrance into postgraduate training.

The NAC Examination is an Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE). Candidates rotate through the same series of stations. Each station is 11 minutes long with two minutes between stations.

At each station, a brief written statement introduces a clinical problem and outlines your tasks (e.g., take a history, describe a physical examination, etc.). In each station, there is at least one Standardized Participant (SP) and a Physician Examiner (PE).

You are presented with typical clinical scenarios. It includes problems in medicine, surgery, pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, psychiatry, preventive medicine, and public health



Medical Council of Canada Exams The Medical Council of Canada Qualifying Examination

[The Medical Council of Canada Qualifying Examination \(MCCQE Part I\)](#) is a one-day, two-part computer-based exam required for entry into Canadian residency and medical licensure, assessing core medical knowledge and clinical decision-making.

The exam consists of 230 multiple-choice questions (MCQs) and clinical decision-making cases (CDMs) divided into two sections of 115 items. Candidates are allowed up to 2-hours and 40 minutes for each section as they complete the first section.

You are presented with clinical, case-based scenarios assessing your medical knowledge and clinical decision-making across two blueprint categories: dimensions of care and physician activities.

You will be tested across all care dimensions, with greater emphasis on acute and chronic care, and on assessment/diagnosis and management over health promotion, psychosocial aspects, communication, and professional behaviours.

Process To Apply For Provisional Registration

If you are applying for [Provisional Registration – Specialty Practice Limited](#),

1. Ensure all documents are submitted to and source verified by [Physiciansapply.ca](#) - **medical diploma, internship document, specialty postgraduate training document (see below), and a specialty certificate.**
 - The postgraduate training document must include that the specialty training program was successfully completed and inclusive dates.
2. Meet the [English Language Proficiency](#) requirements.
3. Ensure there is an employment/sponsorship opportunity in your specialty at [Health Careers Manitoba](#) which **indicates there may be eligibility for sponsorship and employment through the PRA MB-SP at the [University of Manitoba IMG Program](#).**
4. Apply at [CPSM](#)

If you are applying for [Provisional Registration – Family Practice Limited, Manitoba Practice Assessment Program MPAP](#)

- . Ensure all documents are submitted to and source verified by [Physiciansapply.ca](#) - **medical diploma, internship document, family medicine postgraduate training document (if applicable).**
2. Meet the [English Language Proficiency Requirements](#) .
3. **Applications must first be made to the [University of Manitoba PRA MB-FP Program](#)** - See further information on their website regarding intake dates and the application process.
 - Should you be shortlisted by the University of Manitoba IMG Program, your name will be referred to CPSM to make an application at that time.

The Manitoba Licensure Program for International Medical Graduates (MLPIMG)



The Manitoba Licensure Program for International Medical Graduates ([MLPIMG](#)) is a joint initiative of: Manitoba Health, University of Manitoba, and the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Manitoba. It is not a separate program of the College.

The program was established to assist physicians in obtaining licensure (general practice) in Manitoba for those physicians who may not meet the postgraduate clinical training requirements or where enhanced training is required.

Program details

- The International Medical Graduate (IMG) programs offer multiple streams to enable you to practice medicine in Manitoba.
- Two assessment programs and a training program are augmented by mandatory orientation and mentorship opportunities to help you better understand and adapt to the Canadian healthcare system.

Overview of programs

Orientation: A four-week program designed to facilitate integration into the Canadian Healthcare System. The orientation is compulsory for all IMGs accepted into a residency, training or assessment program in Manitoba

International Medical Graduate (IMG) Programs

Family physician training (MLPIMG)

Expected duration: 1 year

The Medical Licensure Program for International Medical Graduates (MLPIMG) is designed to enhance the current skills of internationally educated family physicians. MLPIMG physicians will work in rural and underserved areas of Manitoba for return of service and will work to obtain medical licensure as family physician.

Following a PGY1 program structure, MLPIMG consists of 13 four-week postgraduate medical education rotations (PGME) in:

- Emergency Medicine – 2 rotations (4 weeks urban, 4 weeks rural)
- Family Medicine – 3 rotations (12 weeks urban and rural)
- Gynecology – 1 rotation (4 weeks)
- Obstetrics – 1 rotation (4 weeks)
- Internal Medicine – 2 rotations (8 weeks)
- Pediatrics (outpatient) – 1 rotation (4 weeks)
- Pediatrics (ward) – 1 rotation (4 weeks)
- Psychiatry – 1 rotation (4 weeks)
- Vacation – 1 rotation (4 weeks).

International Medical Graduate (IMG) Programs

Family physician assessment (PRA MB-FP)

Expected duration: 3 months

It is an accelerated route to licensure as a family physician in rural Manitoba. IMG physicians are expected to have the skills on par with rural family physicians in Manitoba. IMGs in the PRA MB-FP will work as family physicians in rural underserved areas of Manitoba for return of service.

The assessment is three months in duration and may have multiple preceptors. The three components of the program are:

- Clinic 1 (four weeks)
- Clinic 2 (four weeks)
- Acute care in ER setting (four weeks)

Specialist assessment (PRA MB-SP)

Expected duration: minimum 3 months

- The PRA MB-SP is a practice-ready assessment program for internationally trained medical specialists who can practice independently and do not need further residency training.
- PRA-Specialty Practice candidates are expected to demonstrate skills acceptable to the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Manitoba (CPSM) and in line with standards for Canadian trained specialists.
- Successful candidates will begin independent practice after the assessment in rural Manitoba.
- The assessment is coordinated by the University of Manitoba IMG Program.
- The assessing department arranges a screening evaluation (typically an interview, OSCE or written examination) prior to agreeing to undertake an assessment.
