Prepare Your Introduction

- Prepare a brief, professional introduction (self-marketing pitch)
- Be ready to share your career goals and background in 30–60 seconds.
- Practice until it sounds natural and confident.

Make Connections

- Talk to people in your industry and community to grow your network.
- Keep in mind that up to 80% of job opportunities are filled through networking.
- · Ask for referrals and follow up on leads.
- Get involved in professional associations, clubs, and sector-specific groups.
- Attend community events and career-related activities.

Engage with Others

- Balance promoting yourself with showing genuine interest in others
- Smile, be approachable, and be kind to everyone you meet.
- Take notes and collect contact information from new connections.
- Send a "thank you" note to maintain the relationship.

Network in Different Ways

In Person

- Introduce yourself to individuals or small groups at events.
- · Bring business cards and ask for others' cards.
- · Speak clearly and confidently.

Online (LinkedIn)

- Connect with potential employers, HR professionals, and industry leaders.
- Use a professional profile photo and personalize your headline.
- Complete all sections: About, Experience, Skills, Education, and Interests.
- Join online groups related to your field.

By Phone

- Speak clearly and professionally.
- Always have a pen and paper ready to take notes.
- Set up your voicemail with a professional message.

Practice Good Networking Etiquette

- · Be on time for meetings and events.
- Dress appropriately and maintain good personal hygiene.
- Be respectful of cultural differences.
- · Listen actively and follow up respectfully.
